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AHCA/NCAL Announces 2018 Bronze National Quality Award Recipients

521 long term and post-acute care providers in 50 states recognized for commitment to quality care

Washington, D.C.—Today, 521 long term and post-acute care providers in 50 states and the District of Columbia were recognized with a 2018 *Bronze - Commitment to Quality Award* by the American Health Care Association and National Center for Assisted Living (AHCA/NCAL). The award is the first of three distinctions possible through the <u>AHCA/NCAL National Quality</u> <u>Award Program</u>, which honors long term and post-acute care providers that have demonstrated their commitment to improving the quality of care for seniors and persons with disabilities.

"The Bronze award exemplifies a dedication to positively impacting quality," said Mark Parkinson, President and CEO of AHCA/NCAL. "I am proud to spotlight our members for their relentless drive to advance our nation's skilled nursing centers and assisted living communities."

Implemented by AHCA/NCAL in 1996, the National Quality Award Program is centered on the core values and criteria of the *Baldrige Performance Excellence Program*, which is also the basis of the metric-based <u>AHCA/NCAL Quality Initiative</u>. The Baldrige program helps organizations across different business sectors use strategies to improve performance and organizational effectiveness.

The Award program has three levels: Bronze, Silver, and Gold. Providers begin the quality improvement process at the Bronze level, where they develop an organizational profile with fundamental performance elements such as vision and mission statements and key strengths and challenges. Bronze applicants must also demonstrate their ability to implement a performance improvement system. Trained Examiners review each application to determine if the center has met the demands of the criteria. Recipients may now move forward in developing approaches and achieving performance levels that meet the criteria required for the *Silver - Achievement in Quality Award*.
